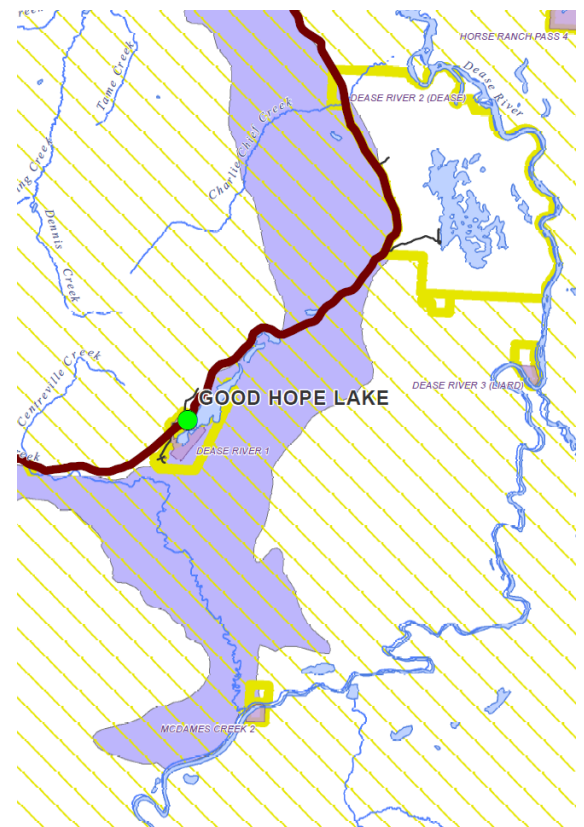
TSA CHO COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Tsa Cho Forestry LP was formed by DRFN to determine if there is forestry opportunity for our community. Tsa Cho, will be hosting a community engagement meeting in regards to the Dease River Forestry Initiative. The project has been underway for almost 4 years and it has now progressed to a point where Tsa Cho Forestry LP (the DRFN owned company) wants the community to become involved. Tsa Cho is seeking community input on the developed DRAFT management plan and will be delivering presentations on options for the management of a possible forest tenure. The meeting will update the community on the work done to date including a status update on the First Nations Woodland License process. The information gathered from this session will be compiled and used to finalize the Management Plan and make final recommendations to Chief and Council on whether or not to proceed with the license and operations. Food and beverages will be served at the meeting.

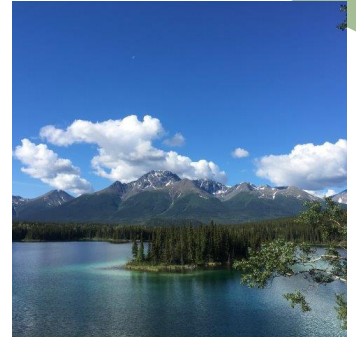

BOYA LAKE PROJECT

The Dease River Development Corporation will be building a new bridge for Boya Lake. The project will also include the construction of a new wheel chair accessible outhouse and boat ramp. The swim dock will also be relocated to a deeper location. These upgrades will render the lake more usable and accessible for members.



CORE BOXES

Silver Tip unfortunately over supplied the Core Boxes last year so there is now enough boxes to get started on this years Drill Program, but the mine may need some more boxes in the fall. In the meantime China Minerals is about to place an order

for 2000 meters for this summer's Drill Program. This should allow DRDC to get started on the project within the next couple of weeks.

WASTE TRANSFER STATION



The closure and remediation of the old dump site and the installation of water monitoring wells has been a great project for the community. Employment for members was generated through the cleanup efforts to remove all of the scattered garbage from the site. The construction of the new Waste Transfer Station has also created significant employment. There is also opportunities for member to maintain long term meaningful employment et the Waste Transfer Station in the form of maintenance jobs. The current maintenance jobs at the facility available to members will be limited to 2 full time maintenance positions.
